The first ever Potomac Highlands Agritourism Summit was held on March 15, at the Misty Mountain Event Barn. Eastern West Virginia Community and Technical College (Eastern) partnered with AFNHA, WVU Extension Service, the WV Department of Agriculture, and the Claude Worthington Benedum Foundation to make this event happen. Notable attendees include Kent Leonhardt, WV Department of Agriculture commissioner, Joe Hatton, WV Department of Agriculture deputy commissioner, and Bill Woodrum, senior program officer of the Claude Worthington Benedum Foundation.

Inclusive Storytelling Program

The National Park Foundation has launched a new nationwide program, Inclusive Storytelling, and with it the first cohort of grantees, with a total of \$2 million granted to projects. 28 National Heritage Areas across 23 states (including AFNHA) are collaborating to research, develop, and share 250 stories in commemoration of the 250th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence. Researchers and writers will work with each National Heritage Area to craft their stories and ready them for interpretive products including websites, exhibits, and podcasts. This collaboration with other NHAs is concurrent to our own America250 project. We have formed a committee to develop an AFNHA America250 program and support sites that tell stories, programs, tours, and exhibits, of all who have contributed to America. The program will feature significant local stories and include underrepresented people who have found home in our area. Recognized as the longest running race throughout the southeast, the 63rd West Virginia Governor's Cup Ski Race was presented by Alpine Festival and hosted by Timberline Mountain on March 11th-12th, 2023. Weaving in Arthurdale By Kendyl Bostic

When Arthurdale was established in 1934, one of the most pressing concerns for newly arrived homesteaders (and the government that supported the project) was jobs. Weaving was a cottage industry that became one of the most important in the town. For a number of years, there has been a small group of Arthurdale Weavers who get together to make projects on some of the historic looms that Arthurdale Heritage owns. When Kendyl Bostic began her AmeriCorps service in fall 2021 she was invited to take an introductory weaving class, and she was immediately hooked.
