AFNHA Awarded Benedum Grant to Grow Tourism

ELKINS, West Virginia (September 24th, 2021) —

The Appalachian Forest National Heritage Area (AFNHA), has been awarded a \$150,000 grant from the Claude Worthington Benedum Foundation to expand regional activities promoting the creative economy in the Appalachian Forest region. Working in partnership with Eastern WV Community and Technical College, this 2-year project will expand work of the Potomac Highlands Creative Economy group to grow tourism and improve communities in region. AFNHA will continue to coordinate partner networking and support tourism attraction development and recovery from COVID impacts, while Eastern WV Community and Technical College (Eastern) will take lead on providing trainings and technical assistance focusing on business development and the growth of agriculture in the Potomac Highlands region.

"We are very excited to continue and grow the work that Eastern began some years ago," says Lukas Ray, Communications and Partnerships Manager with AFNHA. "The future is bright for tourism and community development in the Appalachian Forest region of West Virginia, and we look forward to working with the Benedum Foundation to make this happen! A big thanks goes out to the many who worked to create and implement these programs and efforts that AFNHA is now pleased to lead. "

AFNHA will work to grow the Potomac Highlands Creative Economy group to include all 18 counties within the National Heritage Area, aiming at expanding partnerships and growing networking opportunities for all communities. The regional project will develop and implement tourism enhancements for sites and attractions, resulting in enhanced tourism products, services, and experiences for customers or visitors. The program is designed to complement existing efforts while exploring new opportunities for supporting tourism and creative economy growth. In addition to regular meetings and periodic training opportunities, the project will sponsor a Tourism Summit in the summer of 2022.
