## Free FAA Drone Training Services and certification to be available -

https://easternwv.edu/workforce-education/drone-training/ Over the next year and a half we can offer over 60 certifications for free (traditionally \$1000 each) to receive an FAA drone certification. We are looking for groups of ten students at a time. We work with first responders, and EMT groups to receive specialty training to focus on first responder needs but this can be customized for those in tourism or agriculture. • Academic Pathways at Eastern - Curtis Hakala, Dean of Academic Services

There are a number of programs available <u>https://easternwv.edu/academics/programs/</u> including Wind Technology and Auto Technology. We are also working with local businesses so that high school students can get a head start on their two-year associate's degree. Curtis is leading the wind technology training program that is the only one in the state. They have partnered with Clearway which owns most of the wind farms in WVa. An apprenticeship program has been established and is available to second-year wind tech students. Students gain experience and complete a number of certification programs as part of their training. Last year, five students in the program obtained local employment with Clearway upon graduation. We also have an extensive auto tech program and a two-year nursing program that has grown quite a bit.

There are a number of business programs including 5 programs designed to be completed online. Business management, Accounting, Administrative Support technology. Early childhood development and elementary education (K-6) can also be done online with the residency portion (Formerly student teaching) can be done locally. This is helpful to students who struggle to overcome our unique geographic challenges. Thanks to a partnership with WVUP, students can go on to a four-year degree program online as well. We are planning to grow scholarship programs for each of the programs. Last month we shared updates to the Management Plan that has been a work in progress for the last three years we have completed public meetings, and fieldwork, and have had three task groups active. We have developed a list of assets and held an in-person community exchange (last summer), the rest have been virtual. We have been working on drafting the plan.
