Dr. Dee Singh-Knights is an Associate Professor in the Davis College of Agriculture, Natural Resources and Design and Extension Specialist with the WVU Extension Service at West Virginia University.

She specializes in the areas of agribusiness economics and management with the goal of contributing to the development of sustainable agricultural production systems through research, teaching and extension education. Dee works throughout West Virginia, nationally, and internationally, on a variety of issues including local food systems development, food value chains, direct to consumer marketing, agricultural business viability, collaborative marketing ventures, agritourism and sustainable agriculture.

She coordinates programs such as the WV Agritourism Initiative, the WV Women in Agriculture Training and Outreach Program, the WV Beginning Farmer and Mentorship Program, and the WV Food Safety Training Team.

Her work centers on the belief that there are enormous opportunities to increase production of and demand for locally and regionally produced agricultural products, and to develop new market opportunities for agribusiness operations serving local and expanded markets. Dee works to help 'agripreneurs' capitalize on these growing opportunities while managing the resultant business risks, and to grow the next generation of agribusiness owners, leaders and service providers to ensure a more sustainable model for agriculture.
