- Guest Speaker
  - o Andrew Walker Mountaineer Trail Network
    - Legislatively created recreation authority for non-motorized trails in 16 WV counties. Sister to Hatfield-McCoy Trail Network. Created to limit liability for partners and private landowners within the network. Also acts as an EDA to assist with infrastructure and development programs.
    - Main mission is to identify existing or upcoming enhancement opportunities, and promote recreation opportunities.
    - 5 trail hubs including Big Bear Lake Camplands in Preston County, Camp 70 in Tucker County, Cheat River Water Trail, and Snowshoe Backcountry.
    - Infrastructure projects include installing informational kiosks and Hub signs for wayfinding and emergency services, restrooms, and change rooms.
    - Alex Fliegel (Webster County CVB) How do you deal with pushback from private landowners? Do you help with the trail development/building itself?
      - Liability protection has been the most effective talking point for us. We focus more on enhancing existing trails than building new trails, but can connect with other partners and resources like OEDC at WVU.
    - Martha Macgill (Wills Creek Museum) Are there connections planned in for C&O or GAP trails in MD?
      - No, but we are focused on connectivity with other rail trails. For example, Parkersburg to Pittsburgh trail only needs around 13 extra miles for full connectivity with our network to PA & MD.
    - Jeff Simcoe (Maryland Forest Service) Does the legislation include liability protection for hunting leases that include other types of recreation?
      - Yes, hunting and fishing are included as supported non-motorized recreation in the legislation.
