 - New Hospitality and Tourism management program will begin this fall. Certificate program is 30 credit hours (1 year full-time, also available part-time). Classes are online with some zoom interactions. Participants will be able to explain the regional impact of tourism, demonstrate exceptional customer service skills, be able to market a business, apply standard management practices, and show an understanding of federal, state, & local, laws.
 - Students will complete 100 internship at a tourism business. Have been in touch with places like Capon Springs, Canaan Valley State Park, Warrensville Garden Market, and others in the region as potential partners.
 - Courses include Hospitality Management, Tourism Planning, Marketing, Business Communications, Cost Control, and Hospitality Law. Courses were selected to easily transition to an associate's degree in Business Management.
 - o Can offer 10 students free tuition this fall semester. Registration begins March 29.
